


Reading

Art and Design

- Draw a new character for a story. It could be a person, animal or an unusual or magical creature.
- Choose one of your favourite books and design a new cover for it. Think about who the characters are and the main events in the story to give you some ideas. Remember to include the title of the book and the author.
- Design a new outfit for your book character to wear.

Writing

- Add labels to your picture to describe your new character.
- Book emoji quiz – use the picture clues to guess and writing the book titles.
- Write about your favourite book character. Which book do they appear in? Why do you like them?
- Become an author and create your own book.

Additional Activities

- Develop knowledge of different authors by matching authors to the book they wrote.
- Encourage your child to talk to family members about their favourite books.
- Can grandparents, aunts, uncles, or family friends recommend any books that your child might enjoy?
- Dress up as your favourite character from a book. Take a photo and add to Seesaw.
Make props and masks to help act out part of a book.
- Find things in books and complete the 'Word Hunt' challenge.
